one and one half story, three bay frame residence with six-over-six light wooden sash DESCRIPTION: windows, modern shingle wall cladding, brick foundation and a side gabled roof. This half house has an entrance with fluted pilasters supporting an entablature with triglyphs. There is a later corner rear/side addition and the steps and door have been replaced.

APPROXIMATE DATE: 1875-90

two story, five bay frame residence with one-over-one sash and casement windows, DESCRIPTION: clapboard and shingle wall cladding, brick and stone foundation and a gambrel roof. This Queen Anne house has gabled dormers, a partial front porch with millwork, decorative shingles between floors and in the gables, and decorative banded windows. There is a non contributing modern outbuilding.

APPROXIMATE DATE: 1830-40

DESCRIPTION: two and one half story, five bay frame residence with six-over-six light wooden sash windows, clapboard and shingle wall cladding, brick foundation and a flat roof. The Dering House is Greek Revival in style, with a bracketed cornice with eyebrow windows in the frieze, corner pilasters, and an entrance with pilasters supporting an entablature as well as sidelights and transom. There are two nineteenth century rear additions and an early side addition. There is a contributing, c. 1900 one car garage.

APPROXIMATE DATE: 1875-1900

DESCRIPTION: two and one half story, three bay frame residence with two-over-two light wooden sash windows, aluminum siding, brick foundation and a front gabled roof. This Folk Victorian house has a diamond shaped window in the gable. There is a screened, c. 1910 wrap around porch. There is contributing late nineteenth century workshop (shared with 302-2-7-12) and a non contributing altered early twentieth century garage.

APPROXIMATE DATE: 1875-1895

DESCRIPTION: two and one half story, three bay frame residence with two-over-two light wooden sash windows, asbestos shingle wall cladding, brick foundation and a front gabled roof. This Folk Victorian house has a diamond shaped window in the gable, a Victorian front door with arched lights, a Victorian entrance hood, and a partial side porch. There is a contributing late nineteenth century workshop shared with #302-2-7-11.
